2. „HOW TO SUCCESSFULLY DESIGN AND IMPLEMENT INTERNATIONAL BLENDED MOBILITY PROJECTS

- ONLINE EXCHANGE OF BEST PRACTICE -

In a Blended Mobility project students combine physical meetings abroad with virtual team work from the home base. This way, students and teachers can enjoy the thrill of an international experience without having to do a full Erasmus semester abroad. However, it can be quite challenging to find project partners or to even start a project from scratch. This presentation will provide participants with answers to the following questions and give an introduction to the European project „BlendEd Mobility“:

- How to set up and run international Blended Mobility projects
- How to set up and manage an interdisciplinary team of students
- How to involve partners from industry and economy

The project „**BlendEd Mobility**“ is an international collaboration between 11 universities that has been running since 2008. Each year 2 students of each university are selected to develop an innovative, interdisciplinary project. The students are challenged by a company with a real-life problem and build international teams from different fields of study, such as: **Business Development, Management, Electronics, IT & Design.**

3. „BASIC TRAINING: INTERNATIONALISATION OF THE CURRICULUM THROUGH VIRTUAL EXCHANGE“

- ONLINE TRAINING -

This Training covers all the topics and issues required to set up and implement a class-to-class Virtual Exchange, while also looking at other ready-made options of Virtual Exchange. The aim of the Training is to introduce university educators and staff to Virtual Exchange through experiential learning. Participants will understand the requirements to successfully integrate Virtual Exchange into existing courses and curricula, and will gain experience in online collaboration, communication, teaching and learning. The training requires no previous experience with Virtual Exchange.
